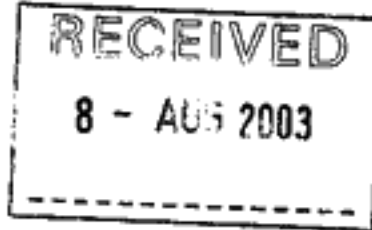

Dear Gill Henderson

Thank you for your letter of 29 July to Antonia Byatt regarding Cinenova which Antonia has passed on to me.

I am sorry that we have been unable to make progress on the question of Cinenova and The Women's Library over the last few months. We have had some staff changes here and I took up the post of Head of Library Services in May. I know that my predecessor had some initial correspondence with Emma Hedditch but progress was obviously curtailed by her departure from The Women's Library in December. I now hope to be able to take the matter forward but need firstly to find out more about the work and collections of Cinenova. I am planning to arrange a visit there for myself and Jennifer Haynes, our Head of Special Collections. Once we have had an opportunity to assess the Cinenova resource in the context of The Women's Library's collections and services we will be in a position to discuss potential future links or support.

I'll be contacting Emma in the next few days regarding the visit and will get back you once we are ready set up a meeting.
